Bendigo Health

With more than 4,500 staff and volunteers and covering an area a quarter of the size of Victoria, Bendigo Health, is an expanding regional health service offering the advantages of city life combined with the beauty and freedom that comes from living in a regional area.

Bendigo Health is a >700 bed service that treats more than 49,000 inpatients, triages more than 60,000 emergency attendees and welcomes more than 1,800 new born babies in a year. In addition, more than 15,000 operations are performed in our operating theatres and more than 100,000 occasions of services are provided to outpatients.

The organisation provides services in surgery, emergency medicine, maternity, women's health, medical imaging, pathology, rehabilitation, community services, residential aged care, psychiatric care, community dental, hospice/palliative care, cardiology, cancer services and renal dialysis to the people of the Loddon Mallee region.

Demand on services is increasing rapidly with Bendigo being one of Victoria's fastest growing regional cities.

The Clinical Operations Division

The Clinical Operations Division encompasses acute, allied health, cancer and mental health services. We provide a range of general medical, surgical and specialty services including but not limited to; Oncology, Cardiology, Renal, Emergency, Women's and Children's, Critical Care, Specialist Clinics, Cancer Clinics and Mental Health Services. Our Allied Health teams provide a diverse range of programs and person-centred care in inpatient, outpatient, community, home and residential care settings.

Within a state-of-the-art hospital, our Ambulatory and Critical Care, Medical Services, Surgical Services and Women's and Children's areas use the latest technologies to provide excellent care. Our world class Cancer Centre uses a multi-disciplinary, integrated approach to treat specific cancers. The Cancer Centre offers medical oncology, radiation oncology, specialist nurses, clinical trials and cancer research, palliative care, and a Cancer Wellness Program.

The Mental Health Service provides psychiatric care and treatment across a large catchment area in Victoria stretching from Swan Hill in the north of the state to Gisborne in the south. Family sensitive practice is central to our models of mental health care and best practice ensures the identification, inclusion and support of families, carers and children.

Each year our onsite Specialist Clinics provide over 100,000 service events, we also see more than 60,000 people in our Emergency Department and welcome over 1,800 babies into the world. The Clinical Operations Division assists with the admission of more than 49,000 patients into the hospital each year.

The Anaesthetics Team

The team is part of Bendigo Health's Surgical Services Department.

The Interventional Suite at Bendigo Health consists of: 11 main operating theatres, 3 procedure rooms, Sterilising Department, Stage 1, 2 and 3 recovery room areas and Day of Surgery Admissions. More than 15,000 elective and emergency surgical procedures are completed every year. Interventional suite staff are required to adapt quickly to emergency situations which can take place at any time during a 24-hour period, seven days a week. Emergencies can include critically ill general surgical, obstetric, and some trauma patients.

The Anaesthesia Team provides anaesthetic services for more than 12,000 operative procedures per year, as 24 hours a day, seven days a week service between regular and on-call capability. The service encompasses pre-anaesthetic assessment, peri-operative optimisation, intra-operative anaesthesia, acute pain management, anaesthesia outside the operating suite, and teaching/education roles throughout the organisation.

Our team includes Staff Anaesthetists, Registrars (at many levels of training), Anaesthetic Technicians, Administrative staff and Acute Pain Nurses.

Our team are committed to evidence-based practice, continuous quality improvement, and teaching. Bendigo Health has accreditation for medical practitioners who wish to become Fellows of the Australian and New Zealand College of Anaesthetists (FANZCA), for up to 24 months of training time. Bendigo Health is also an accredited site for Diploma of Rural Generalist Anaesthesia trainees ("GP Anaesthetists"). Our pool

of Registrars rotate from metropolitan-based training schemes in Melbourne, the Victorian Regional Anaesthetic Training Network (VRTN), and from other Critical Care Units within Bendigo Health.

The Position

The position may be flexible to the experience of the applicant. We are looking for a Registrar/Provisional Fellow (PF) to join our team of approximately 12 Registrars.

As a PF, this position is accredited by ANZCA (PF0199) for up to 12 months, and while currently advertised as a 6-month post, may be extended by negotiation.

As a Registrar position, BH is accredited for all phases of training (IT/BT/AT), and this position may be offered to a candidate seeking to join as an Introductory Trainee, but is NOT currently attached to a rotational training allocation.

Registrars at Bendigo Health are an integral part of the health care service team, providing leadership and direction to a dedicated staffing group. The primary responsibilities of the Anaesthetics Registrars are to ensure that care is delivered in a safe and timely manner. This will be achieved by working in partnership with the Specialist Anaesthetists. This position is designed to provide graduated levels of training and experience, consistent with the goals and objectives, and under appropriate supervision.

Responsibilities and Accountabilities

Key Responsibilities

- Delivery of Anaesthesia in operating theatre under the supervision of Specialist Anaesthetists.
- Participation in on site staffing roster providing 24-hour anaesthetic cover to the hospital.
- Pre-operative assessment of patients who will be receiving an anaesthetic.
- Member of the Cardiac Arrest ("Code") Team for cardiac arrests.
- Membership of Surgical Trauma Management / Reception Team with Surgical Registrar and Emergency Department Staff.
- Participation in Quality Assurance activities of the Department, including multi-disciplinary activities.
- Liaison with Nursing and Allied Health Staff in ensuring a high standard of patient care and efficient use of available resources.
- Teaching and supervision of HMOs and Medical Students.
- Other reasonable duties as specified by the Chief Medical Officer and Director of Anaesthesia.
- Participation in an equitable manner in the on-call Anaesthetic roster.

A specific requirement of this position is continued professional development through on the job learning, attendance at clinical reviews, internal tutorial programs presented by Fellows in Anaesthesia and attendance at appropriate external workshops as required by their parent College.

Generic Responsibilities
