Stroke management

It is well known that stroke care service delivery is varied between rural and metropolitan areas. High quality stroke care is essential to improve survival - but how? This week focuses on Stroke Management.

Stroke is one of Australia's biggest killers and a leading cause of disability, but more than 80% of strokes can be prevented.

Facts about Stroke in Australia

- There were 27,428 Australians who experienced stroke for the first time in their lives in 2020, which equates to one stroke every 19 minutes
- More than 445,087 Australians are living with the effects of stroke
- In 2020, 24 percent of first-ever strokes occurred in people aged 54 years and under
- Without action by 2050 it is predicted that the number of first-ever strokes experienced by Australians annually will increase to 50,600, or one stroke every 10 minutes

Despite a lack of resources available in rural areas, using clinical guidelines including a clinical pathway has been shown to improve outcomes for patients suffering stroke.
