# **Asthma**

Australia has one of the highest rates in the world. This serious condition leads to the deaths of almost 400 Australians a year. This week we will learn more about Asthma

#### Asthma in Australia

- One in nine people have Asthma (2.7million)
- Asthma affects people of all ages
- It can appear at all stages of life
- Approximately 80% of asthma hospitalisations are preventable
- Almost half (44%) of the hospitalisations are for children aged 0-14

# Common barriers to correct use of Asthma medicines

- Misunderstanding purpose of medicines
- Concerns about side effects
- Taking wrong dose
- Skipping doses to save on treatment costs
- Incorrect inhaler technique
- Poor perception of airflow limitation
- Social pressure from peer group, employer, colleagues or family (e.g. expectation that should have grown out of asthma)
- Beliefs about health that conflict with or undermine confidence in conventional asthma medicines.
