Training Pathway

Career Progression at Bendigo Health can include intern, PGY2/3 and registrar positions. All College training requirements can be completed without leaving Bendigo Health (depending on the focus of advanced training; e.g. sub-specialising in forensic psychiatry or child and adolescent psychiatry would require advanced training to be undertaken in Melbourne). There is a dedicated local Coordinator of Training (CoT), a position filled by one of our consultant psychiatrists, who ensures the training needs of all DiTs are met, not just registrars. One senior registrar or advanced trainee is also the nominated "Principal Registrar" at Bendigo Mental Health Services. The Junior Medical staffing group in Mental Health is tight knit and supportive, making the experience of working or training in Psychiatry within Bendigo Health Mental Health Services one which is connected and supportive. Support is available from the CoT, experienced registrars (including the principal registrar), your supervisor, your colleagues and the Clinical Director. The Clinical Director meets with all DiTs every month to address any issues which may arise from time to time.
