FAQs for Allied Health, Nursing, Midwifery and Paramedicine students

When will I be sent my roster?

- Allied Health students: this will be available from your education provider or supervisor.
- Nursing/Midwifery and Paramedicine students: your education provider will send you
 your roster prior to placement commencing.

Once rosters are finalised it is very unlikely rostering requests will be facilitated.

ICT Access and student orientation module

An email will be sent to you approximately 10 days prior to placement to advise you of your ICT log in details and how to log in and access the GOLD learning management system. These user details, along with your new password will be used for each subsequent placement you attend at Bendigo Health. You are strongly advised to log in and complete the orientation module prior to placement. Completion of this module is only required once.

How do I arrange accommodation for my placement?

Where do I go on the first day of placement?

Present to the ward or department at the time shown on your roster. For Nursing, Midwifery and Paramedicine students, wayfinding information is located in the Undergraduate Orientation Guide.

What do I do if I am unwell and can't attend placement?

If you are unwell, you must not attend placement until you are fully recovered. Please call the ward or department and your education provider to advise that you are unable to attend. Your education provider is responsible for determining and arranging makeup days. Please discuss this directly with them, not your supervisor.
