Bendigo Health

With more than 4,500 staff and volunteers and covering an area a quarter of the size of Victoria, Bendigo Health, is an expanding regional health service offering the advantages of city life combined with the beauty and freedom that comes from living in a regional area.

Bendigo Health is a 700 bed service that treats more than 45,000 inpatients, triages more than 65,000 emergency attendees and welcomes more than 1,600 new born babies in a year. In addition more than 15,000 operations are performed in our operating theatres and more than 100,000 occasions of services are provided in our clinics to outpatients.

The organisation provides services in emergency, maternity, women's health, medical imaging, pathology, rehabilitation, community services, residential aged care, psychiatric care, community dental, hospice/palliative care, cardiology, cancer services and renal dialysis to the people of the Loddon Mallee region.

With our main campus based in Bendigo, our services extend throughout the Loddon Mallee with sites in areas such as Mildura, Echuca, Swan Hill, Kyneton and Castlemaine.

Demand on services is increasing rapidly with Bendigo being one of Victoria's fastest growing regional cities.

The Clinical Operations Division

The Clinical Operations Division encompasses acute, allied health, cancer and mental health services. We provide a wide range of general medical, surgical and specialty services including but not limited to; Oncology, Cardiology, Renal, Emergency, Women's and Children's, Critical Care, Specialist Clinics, Cancer Clinics and Mental Health Services. Our Allied Health teams provide a diverse range of programs and person centred care in inpatient, outpatient, community, home and residential care settings.

Within a state-of-the-art hospital, our Ambulatory and Critical Care, Medical Services, Surgical Services and Women's and Children's areas use the latest technologies to provide excellent care. Our world class Cancer Centre uses a multi-disciplinary, integrated approach to treat specific cancers. The Cancer Centre offers medical oncology, radiation oncology, specialist nurses, clinical trials and cancer research, palliative care, and a Cancer Wellness Program.

The Mental Health Service provides psychiatric care and treatment across a large catchment area in Victoria stretching from Swan Hill in the north of the state to Gisborne in the south. Family sensitive practice is central to our models of mental health care and best practice ensures the identification, inclusion and support of families, carers and children.

Each year our onsite Specialist Clinics provide over 100,000 service events, we also see more than 60,000 people in our Emergency Department and welcome around 1700 babies into the world. The Clinical Operations Division assists with the admission of more than 50,000 patients into the hospital each year.

The Surgical Services Department

The Surgical Unit consists of two wards 5B and 6B.

The General Surgery department is part of Bendigo Health's Surgical Services Directorate.

The Team consists of a number of General Surgeons, assisted by Registrars, who provide a wide range of services to both public and private patients, some of whom also provide services to Echuca and Castlemaine.

The Surgical Unit specialises in a range of conditions related to surgery including the pre and post-operative care of patients. The specialties include minor and major abdominal; ear, nose and throat (ENT); head and neck; facio-maxillary; urology; reconstructive; and thoracic surgery. In addition, the Surgical Unit plays a pivotal role in patient flow throughout the organisation and Loddon Mallee region by facilitating transfers to and from the Emergency Department, ICU, Recovery, other departments and other health facilities.

The Position

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This role is one of a Fractional Specialist General Surgeon within The Clinical Operations Division.

The responsibilities of the role are to provide highest standards of specialist General Surgical care and other relevant clinical services for patients of Bendigo Health, as well as supervision and training of junior medical staff in the general surgical service.

Responsibilities and Accountabilities

- Provide specialist-level general surgical care to patients of Bendigo Health, including:
 - General, laparoscopic and open procedures
 - Endoscopic procedures (gastroscopy and colonoscopy)
 - Breast surgery interest would be advantageous
- On-call duties as the consultant on call and the ability to conduct a full range of emergency surgical procedures undertaken within a regional referral hospital.
- Participate in the provision of outpatient services in General Surgery to the people of Bendigo, including assessment and management of new patients and follow-up of patients cared for by the service.
- Provide best practice care to all patients within the context of current professional knowledge and organisational resources.
- Provide clinical and professional leadership, supervision and teaching for junior medical and other clinical staff.
- Commitment to Teaching and Research, including participation in RACS Education
- Specifically ensure an adequate level of record-keeping and communication at the junior medical staff level, promoting team work and ensuring adequate recording and auditing of complications for clinical review.
- Participate actively in service audit, clinical meetings and Quality Assurance Activities.
- Ensure appropriate interaction and service integration with other relevant services, including Medical and Critical Care and the Emergency Department.
- Participate actively in developing practical solutions to system deficiencies identified at audit.
- Promote and encourage compliance with College Maintenance of Professional Standards programs.
- Further develop clinical skills consistent with special interests and the role of Bendigo Health.
- Promote and develop clinical research within the department.

Specialist Style

Specialists are expected to perform duties that may be required other than those specified in this position description to ensure that the requirements of the organisation are met. Although Bendigo Health supports the concept of work/life balance, specialists are expected to have a willingness and ability to occasionally work non-standard business hours. Specialists are also required to:

- Lead by example and demonstrate behaviour in accordance with Bendigo Health's values

- Treat all subordinate staff with respect and dignity
- Promote equity and fairness which includes compliance with employment law and Bendigo Health's People & Culture policies and procedures
- Comply with all delegated authorities and limits. Actively communicate any problems, changes or issues that senior management should be aware of
- Be responsible for being aware of, understanding and applying the terms and conditions of relevant legislation that may be in force from time to time.

Generic Responsibilities

Code of Conduct - The Victorian Government's Code of Conduct is binding on all Bendigo Health staff. Contravention of a provision in the code may constitute misconduct and/ or regarded as a breach of the employee's employment agreement and will be dealt with under the organisations Counselling and Disciplinary Action Policy.

Compliance with policies and procedures - All Bendigo Health's policies and procedures are set out in its clinical and managerial policy manuals located on the intranet under PROMPT and in hard copy. All staff must ensure they comply with policies, procedures and standard ways of work practices when carrying out their work. Any breach in compliance may result in disciplinary action.

Occupational Health and Safety - Every staff member has the responsibility to take reasonable care of their own health and safety and the safety of others, to cooperate with Bendigo Health's OH&S policies and to participate in appropriate safety education and evaluation activities. All staff are expected to participate in reporting any health, safety and wellbeing issues. Any breach in compliance may result in disciplinary action.

Infection Control - Every staff member has the responsibility to minimise incidents of infection/ cross infection of residents, staff, visitors and the general public. All staff must adhere to the policies and procedures as set out in Bendigo Health's infection control manuals. Any breach in compliance may result in disciplinary action.

Confidentiality - All information concerning Bendigo Health, its patients, clients, residents and staff should remain strictly confidential. Any unauthorised disclosure of such information may result in disciplinary action.

Quality Improvement - Bendigo Health is dedicated to improving the quality and safety of health services by providing care within the following domains of quality: Consumer Participation, Clinical Effectiveness, Effective Workforce and Risk Management. As a result, we apply the concept of the quality cycle for all our quality activities, initiatives and projects thereby ensuring the best possible care and treatment results are achieved. The underlying principle of the cycle is that an activity is not complete until evaluation shows that it has been effective and reached the desired outcome. As a Bendigo Health employee you have a responsibility to participate in and commit to ongoing quality improvement activities using the framework of the NSQHSS (National Safety and Quality Health Service Standards).

Diversity – Each person has a right to high-quality health care and opportunities regardless of diversity factors, which might include aspects such as cultural, ethnic, linguistic, religious background, gender, sexual

Key Selection Criteria

Essential

- Requirement to be a practicing General Surgeon credentialed to practice with Bendigo Health
- Surgeon to hold a fellowship of the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons (RACS) in General Surgery or equivalent and be currently registered with the Medical Board of Australia
- Demonstrated clinical ability commensurate with that expected of a qualified specialist surgeon.
- Thorough understanding of the relevant legislation pertaining to Medical Officers
- Evidence of ongoing professional development to continually update personal medical knowledge and skills
- Demonstrated experience and knowledge of clinical governance and the underpinning framework for safety and quality in health care.
- Demonstrated capacity to communicate with peers and management staff to achieve organisational goals.
- Good understanding of the Victorian public health system; in particular the clinical and quality requirements for care delivery.
- Ability to work as part of a team, as well as to work independently.

Desirable

- Breast, Upper Gastrointestinal and Endocrine specialty interest desirable

Mandatory Requirements

National Police Record Check A current and satisfactory National Police Record Check must be completed by all new staff prior to commencement at Bendigo Health.
