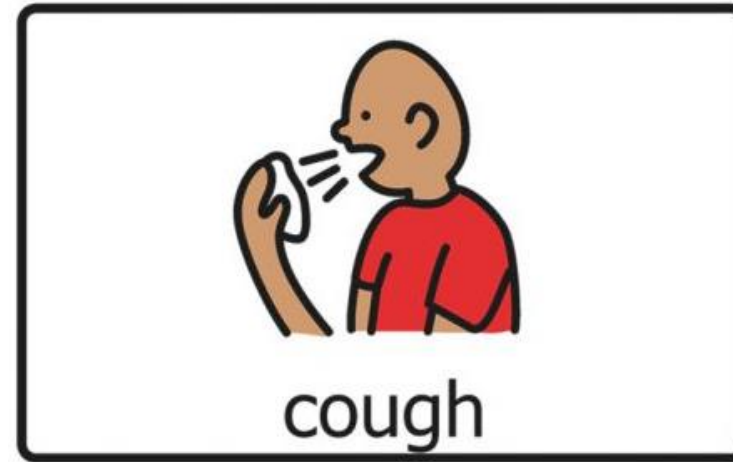
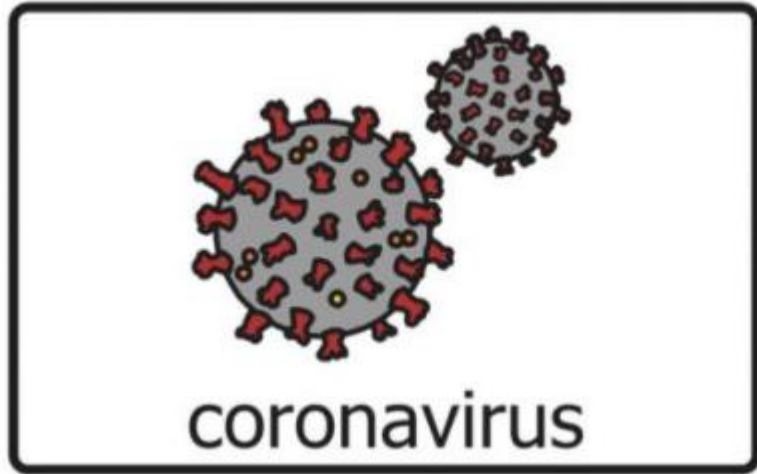
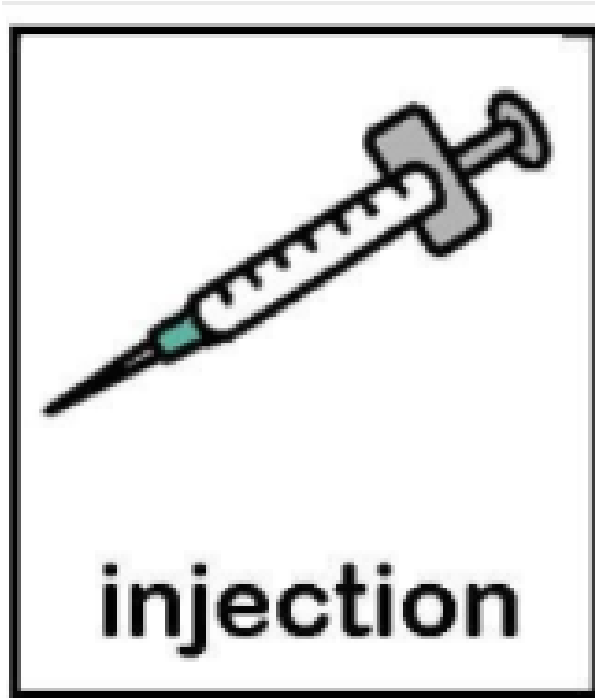


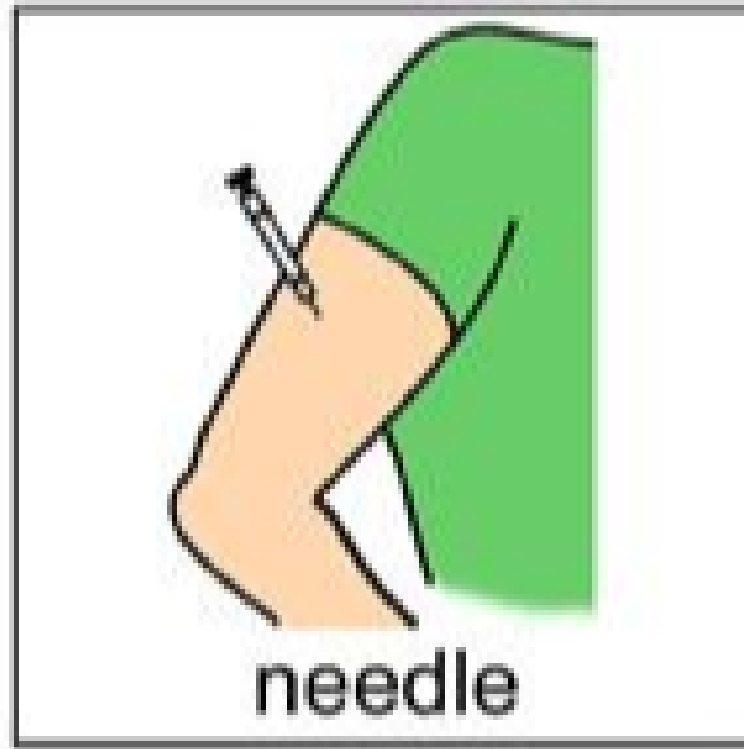
Getting my COVID Vaccination at home



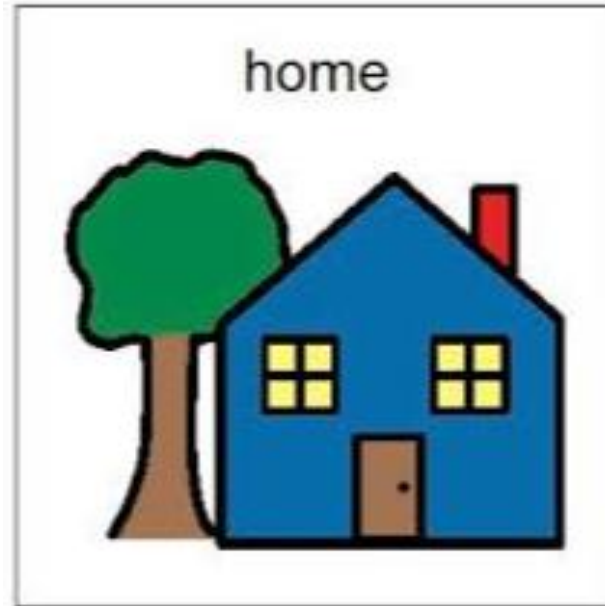
COVID-19 is a virus that has made many people very sick.



There is a vaccine,
the vaccine is in a needle.



The vaccine needle puts medicine in my body to keep me from getting sick from COVID-19.

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Can I get other vaccines, like the flu shot, at the same time as the COVID-19 vaccine?
No, you will need to wait at least one week after getting the COVID-19 vaccine before getting other vaccinations.


If I am vaccinated against COVID-19, can I still spread the virus to others?
The vaccine trials conducted did not look at the vaccine's ability to prevent virus transmission. We do know the vaccine is very effective at preventing illness in those receiving the vaccine. Because there is no data demonstrating the ability of the vaccines to prevent viral transmission, it is important to continue to wear a mask and socially distance even after getting vaccinated.

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In the basket there is a form that the nurses will read to me to tell me about my COVID Vaccination.



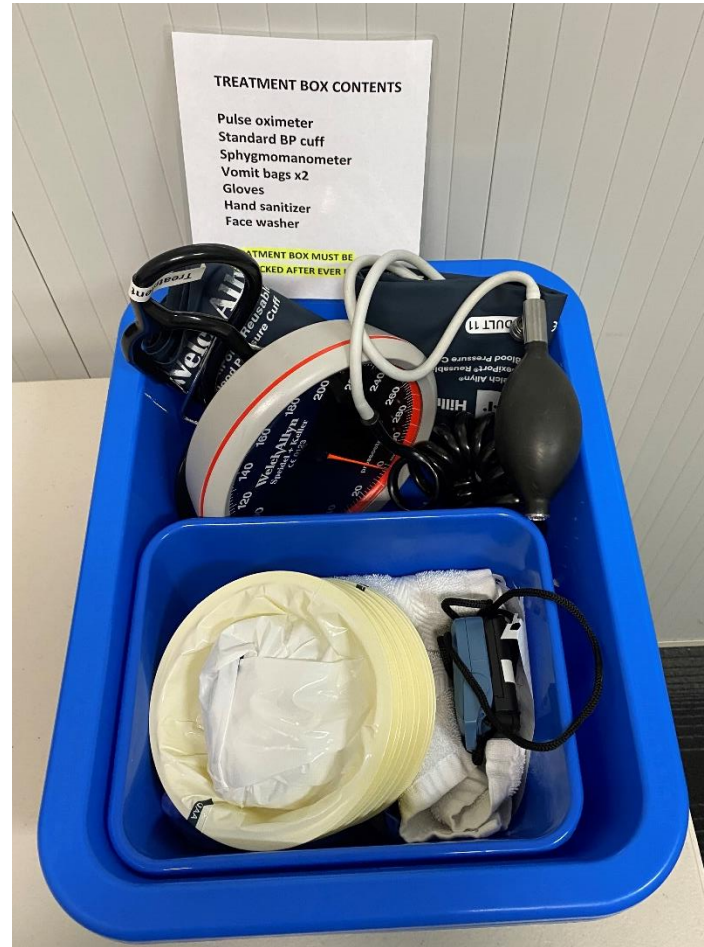
There is a COVID-19 needle in a green bag.

Vaccination.



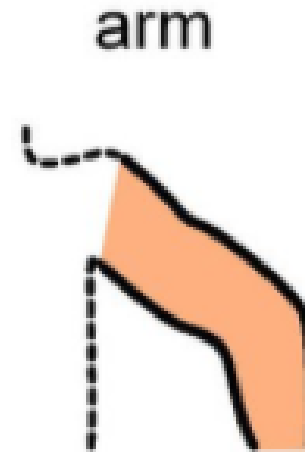
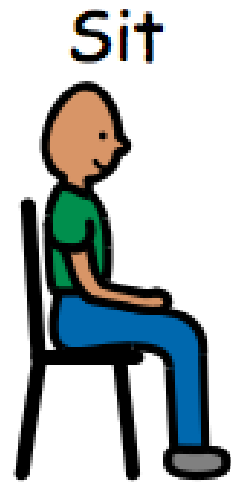
There is hand sanitiser and sanitiser wipes to make sure everything is clean.
I might not like the smell of the sanitiser.



There is a box of things to help me feel better if I feel sick after my COVID-19 Vaccination.



The Nurses will bring a computer with them.
They will put my information in so that others know I've had the COVID-19
vaccination.



When I am ready I will find a seat where I feel comfortable.
The nurse will roll up my sleeve.



The nurse will give me the vaccine needle.
It will feel like a pinch or a prick.
I will sit very still.



The nurse will put a cotton ball and some tape on my arm.



I will need to sit and wait to make sure I am safe and healthy.
The nurse will give me a lollipop and a bottle of water.



After the nurse tells me it's okay, I am done for the day.
The nurse will say goodbye and they will leave my house.
